As we all know, the choices our young people make for higher education and into the world of work will impact the rest of their working life. With the current retirement age at 66, rising to 67 by 2028 and projections of increasing further within their lifetime, it means we could see these young people in the workplace for over 50 years. Alongside this, the labour market is ever changing, more drastically since covid, along with the continued advances of technology and accessibility.

We believe it is vital students become aware of the choices available to them, the life and career experiences people have had and how their choices have impacted the careers they are now in, whilst also getting to know what work is available both locally and nationally.

During the evening, you are invited to attend talks from Springwood Sixth Form, The College of West Anglia and Norfolk Pathways, which cover apprenticeship and employment routes. These 15 minute talks (on a carousel rotation to allow you to attend all three if you wish) will explain the options and processes and give you an insight into the courses available and the application procedures, allowing you to prepare to support your child through this process.
